**Willard Family Papers, 1830-1968 (bulk 1880-1935)
Collection #2003-003**

ABSTRACT:

This is a collection of family correspondence and personal papers, business documents, and photographs related to the Willard family of Haddonfield, New Jersey. Elizabeth Sayer Willard (1814-1907) was active in the temperance movement in the late 19th century and was a prolific correspondent. The collection includes nearly 400 letters she received from family and friends between 1846 and 1902, many with a religious theme. The collection also includes records of the Haddonfield Chapter of the Women's Christian Temperance Union (WCTU) from 1887 to 1938, as well as papers related to the county, state and national WCTU organizations. In addition, the collection contains records from Willard's Telephone Drugstore in Haddonfield, NJ, operated by Elizabeth S. Willard's son, Rowland Willard (1848-1922) from 1882 into the early 20th century.

BIOGRAPHICAL / HISTORICAL BACKGROUND:

Dr. Rowland Willard (1794-1884) and wife Elizabeth Sayer (Borland) Willard (1814-1907) moved to Haddonfield, NJ around 1867.

Elizabeth was born in 1814 and grew up in Ohio. In 1832 she married Dr. Rowland Willard (1794-1884), a physician who had previously traveled throughout the western frontier of the United States and Mexico. The couple moved from Cincinnati to Covington, Kentucky and then to Oswego, Indiana and Warsaw, Indiana before relocating to Hammonton, New Jersey by 1860. Dr. Willard was a large landowner and land speculator in each town, and both he and Elizabeth were dedicated Baptists. Elizabeth became involved with temperance efforts in Warsaw, Indiana, with a group that later became part of the Women's Christian Temperance Union (WCTU). She remained involved in this organization for much of her adult life, as did her daughter-in-law, Isabel (Webb) Willard, and granddaughter, Elizabeth May (Willard) Levis. By 1867, Dr. Willard and Elizabeth had apparently retired to Haddonfield. They had three children who survived to adulthood: Nelson Loomis Willard, Lyman Manly Willard, and Rowland Willard.

All three sons followed their father into the medical field. Nelson Loomis Willard (1837-1920) went into dentistry. He lived and practiced in Torquay in Devon, England, and then in London for a number of years before moving back to the U.S. with his wife Artimesia "Artie" (Baker). He then settled in Washington, D.C. Artie died in early 1918, and Nelson married Mary A. Beck later that same year in Warsaw, Indiana. Lyman Manly Willard (1842-1903) became a physician and a druggist. He moved west after graduating medical college in Philadelphia, spending time in western Pennsylvania and Colorado before settling in Loomis, Washington. He married Elizabeth Canfield in 1885 and later operated the E. C. Willard Drugstore in Loomis. Rowland Willard (1848-1922) became a pharmacist and after serving as an apprentice at Braddock's Pharmacy in Haddonfield, he opened Willard's Telephone Drugstore in Haddonfield in 1883. His naming strategy worked: the drugstore received the first telephone line in Haddonfield in 1884. Rowland Willard married Isabel Hill Webb (1852-1928) and they had three children: Elizabeth May Willard, Clara Bell Willard, and Rowland Webb Willard.

Elizabeth May Willard (1881-1969) became a school teacher and taught in other New Jersey towns before returning to Haddonfield. She married Harry Benjamin Levis (1872-1955) in 1919 at the Haddonfield Baptist Church. She was involved in various social causes through the church. Clara Bell Willard (1887-1962) married James King (1874-1928) and had two sons: James Willard King (1909-

2000) and Rowland Willard King (1911-1980). Rowland Webb Willard (1882-1928) married Anna Stuart Dunphey (1893-1935) in 1916. They had two children: George Stuart Willard (1918-1975) and Helen Elizabeth Willard (1923-1997). Helen Elizabeth Willard married Lawrence Raymond Andress in 1948.

A note about names in the collection: some individuals' names and nicknames change depending on the correspondent. Some of the most common name variations include:

- Elizabeth S. Willard's middle name is written as both "Sayer" or "Sayre"
- Elizabeth May (Willard) Levis is often referred to as "Lizzie May," but she is also referred to as "May" or "May E."
- Rowland Willard (1848-1922) is sometimes referred to as Roland, Rollie, Roly, Rowly or Rohly
- Elizabeth Canfield Willard is referred to as "Libbie"

SCOPE AND CONTENT NOTE:

The collection contains organizational records, notebooks and journals, correspondence, ephemera, loose documents, newspaper articles, photographs, and published materials. The material is primarily related to three generations of the Willard family.

The collection is arranged in five series:

Series 1: Women's Christian Temperance Union (WCTU)

This series includes material from the Haddonfield, Camden County, New Jersey state and National WCTU organizations. Elizabeth Sayer Willard, her daughter Elizabeth May (Willard) Levis, and daughter-in-law Isabel Hill (Webb) Willard were all involved in the local WCTU organization.

Of particular interest are the sets of bound, handwritten minutes from the meetings of the Haddonfield Chapter of the WCTU from 1887 to 1938, including the constitution of the organization written in 1887. These are stored in box 10.

Series 2: Willard's Telephone Drugstore

This series includes material related to the business of Willard's Telephone Drugstore in Haddonfield from 1902 to 1923. The Reference Binder contains a fairly complete record of work done on the drugstore building at 131 Kings Highway East, Haddonfield, between 1908 and 1912, including contracts for all major systems and receipts for work as well as some receipts for purchase of stock for

the store. The Ledger contains the accounts for the drugstore from 1906 to 1919 organized alphabetically by customer name.

Notable items:

- In the Reference Binder: A full set of hand-drawn floor plans of the store and living quarters at 131 Kings Highway, Haddonfield (Box 2, Folder 2)
- In the Ledger: Under letters V and W, the “Opioid Inventory” of opium and coca stock for 1915 to 1919 (Box 2, Folder 4)

Series 3: Personal Papers

This series contains primarily correspondence dating from the 1840s through the 1940s, with the majority of the letters sent to Elizabeth Sayer Willard from family, friends and associates.

The correspondence is organized by recipient, unless otherwise noted.

Elizabeth is often addressed as “Sister Willard,” and many of the letters concern religious topics. Approximately 25% of the letters are from Elizabeth’s son Nelson and his wife Artie. The series also includes some personal papers of Elizabeth S. Willard and other members of the family, including poetry, journals, essays and some legal documents, such as leases and contracts.

Notable items:

- An extensive set of materials relate to the 1919 wedding of Elizabeth May Willard to Harry B. Levis, including over 100 calling cards and gift cards, the receipt for her wedding gown, newspaper announcement, and invitations. (Box 3, Folders 2-4)
- A letter written to Elizabeth S. Willard in 1865 from Catherine Revel alternates lines in French (blue ink) and the English translation (brown ink). (Box 3, Folder 9)
- The booklet “My Late Experience” was written by Elizabeth S. Willard about her Christian faith and published in 1887. (Box 6, Folder 5)
- Dr. Willard and wife Elizabeth S. Willard wrote two letters in 1861 and 1862 to Nelson Willard while he was a POW in a Confederate prison camp in Richmond, VA. (Box 7, Folder 5)
- Dr. Willard kept records of a set of medical cases with their treatment in a small journal in early 1873. They appear to have been cases he saw at the Agnew Clinic at the University of Pennsylvania. Later his wife Elizabeth used this notebook as a diary from 1886 to 1892. (Box 10)

Series 4: Photographs

The photographs are all black and white photographic prints. They range from small wallet size to oversized mounted prints of individual portraits, groups, and buildings. A significant portion of the photographic material is related to Clara Bell (Willard) King and her family. The photographs include other members of the Willard family and related family members, as well as a significant number of unidentified individuals and groups.

Series 5: Miscellaneous Materials

The majority of the materials in this series are publications, fragments of documents, and newspaper clippings, many related to suffrage, prohibition and religious topics.

Notable items:

- Five issues of the *The Red Cross Magazine* from the war years of 1918 and 1919 (Box 11, Folders 13-14)
- “On Guard”, a 1918 venereal disease control pamphlet, published by the New Jersey Board of Health, directed toward young women being deployed overseas with the armed forces (Box 9, Folder 15)
- “Indian American Youth Today” a 1934 leaflet with a striking graphic design (Box 9, Folder 15)
